



Nomination Scoring

Women's Hall of Fame

General questions: (if the nominee doesn't fit into one of these criteria – they are ineligible)

The nominee:

- _____ A woman who lives and or works in Lebanon County or
- _____ Has played an integral part in the implementation of project(s) that have benefited the Lebanon Valley or
- _____ Has worked as Hidden Hero touching lives in a positive way
- Is the nominee a previous inductee or current commission member? _____ No _____ Yes (ineligible)

Accomplishments (30%)	<p>Evaluation Questions</p> <p>Does the nominee have accomplishments in their chosen field of endeavor, professional or otherwise? Any awards or recognition?</p> <p>What have they accomplished? How did they accomplish this?</p>
Contributions (30%)	<p>Has the nominee made enduring contributions to the social, cultural, economic or political well-being of the community, state or nation?</p> <p>What have they done to impact or make lives better in Lebanon County or beyond?</p> <p>How has the nominee enhanced that status of women and girls in Lebanon County?</p>
Personal (25%)	<p>Is the nominee a positive influence on and a role model for other women?</p> <p>What makes them an unsung hero or mentor? How did they make their impact?</p>
Summary (15%)	<p>Does the nominator write a compelling narrative as to why the nominee should be chosen for this award?</p>

Each nomination is reviewed by the members of the selection committee independently many times. After this process is completed, the nomination is graded using a rubric weighted and reflective of the questions asked on the nomination. The third step is the meeting of the selection committee, where the individual grades are submitted by each member. The fourth step is done by dividing the total score by the number of members of the selection committee and calculating the average score. The top scores are those that will be inducted into the Hall of Fame. (90-100%).
